

GENERAL MANAGER'S STATUS REPORT

April 11, 2019

Treatment Plants

The treatment plants continue to meet constituent discharge requirements on a routine basis. We did violate some of our daily flows in March. The cause was the large rain events this year.

Collection System

Crews are continuing with regular operations, daily inspections of District lift stations, issuance of correction notices for repairs on private laterals, and inspections on all repairs. Throughout the month, collection staff inspected waterways and the district effluent outfall line after all rain events. Last month the District hydraulically cleaned 9,621 feet of line and CCTV 5,180 feet of line in the Collection System.

Strategic Plan

Master Plan: The District is proceeding with three important steps in getting phase one of the Master Plan implemented.

- Engineering
- Applying to the State Revolving Fund.
- CEQA +

Regulatory Compliance: District is maintaining a >90% compliance currently through the 2019 calendar year...i.e. < 2 SSO's, RWQCB Plant Discharge Requirements.

Customer Service: The District continues to maintain < 1% customer complaints.

Facilities & Infrastructure: The District entered into a MOU with the State on August 23, 2018 to replace the Cleghorn force main and it is scheduled to be started October 2019.

There have been no discharge violations due to Equipment Failure.

Professional Development: All safety protocols are being utilized to promote "Zero Lost Time" due to injuries.

- On April 9, 2019 the District had a small spill of raw sewage. We lost approximately 220 gallons from a manhole on Mormon Springs Rd. The District recovered approximately 110 gallons.
- We had a nice "thank you" E-mail from Patrice Copeland the Supervising Engineer at Lahontan Water Board. Also, one from Patty Kouyoumdjian Lahontan Executive Officer in Lake Tahoe. They commented us on how we handled the "snack bar" spill into Lake Gregory.
